

Carbon footprint of Magni Mundi 2022

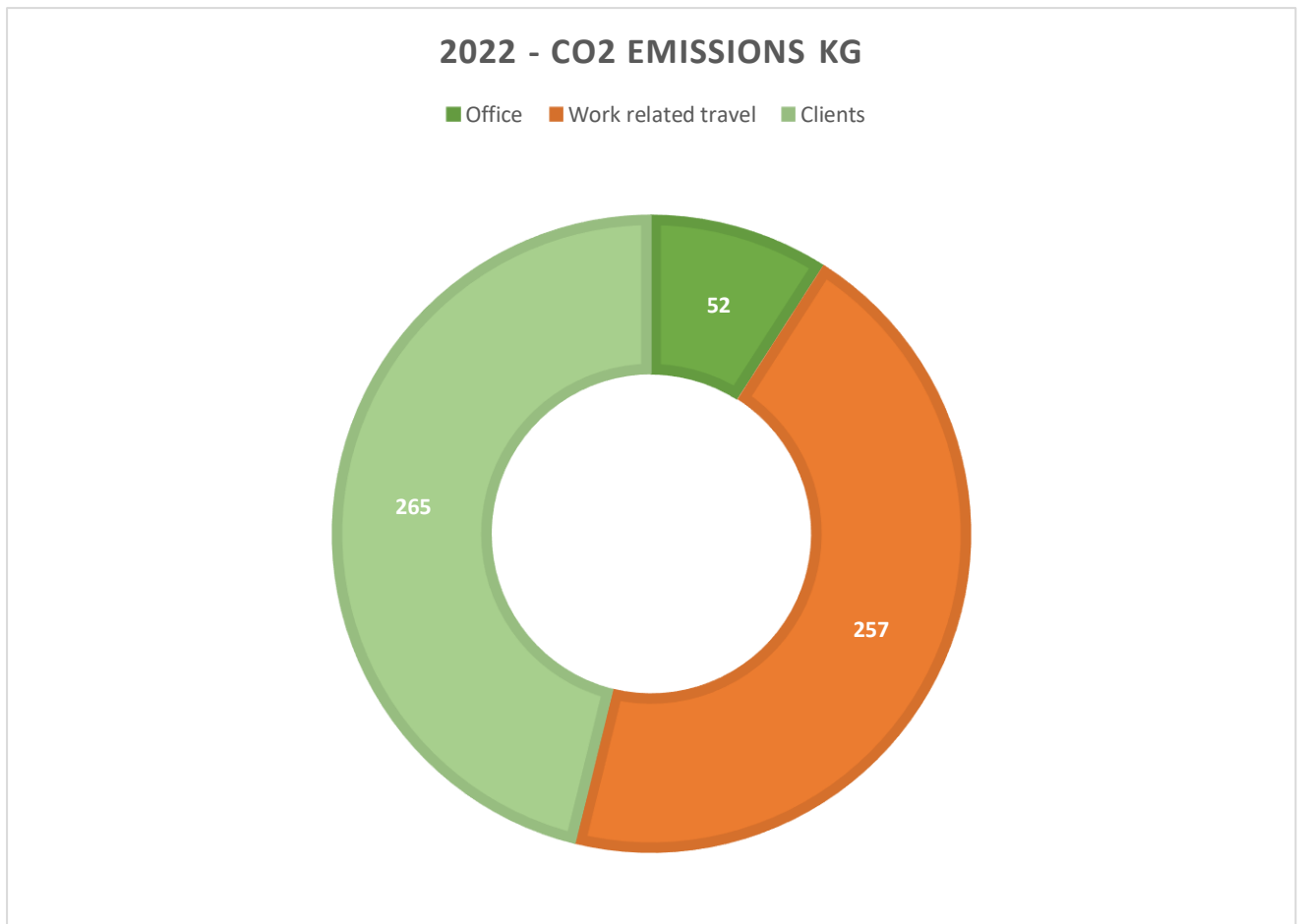
Overview

In 2022 was the first year since the Covid-19 when we started networking with other companies again. In this situation, we felt it was very important to meet people face to face. This is why our CO2 emissions for Work related travel are higher than before. For our travel needs, we used either train or hybrid car.

There were significantly less clients than before Covid, so in that aspect, our CO2 emissions were lower than normal.

Magni Mundi doesn't own properties or rent office space. We network virtually and use our home offices. That is why our basic CO2 emissions are very low. An estimate has been made for using our homes as offices.

Magni Mundi CO2 emissions in 2022 were total of 574 kg.



Action plan for 2023

We need more data to be able to start reducing our carbon footprint. We have decided to calculate emissions for 2023 before making big changes to our business since so far (May 2023) this year seems to be closer to what it was before Covid. We still don't have as many foreign clients, but we are getting more requests for the years 2024-25.

We have identified key numbers to monitor:

- Number of clients participating in our guided tours/buying our travel packages and CO2 footprint produced per client.
- Work related travel.
- Office-related emissions, for example printed brochures per year.

In 2023 we will continue to measure CO2 emissions and continue open communication about our own and our suppliers' emissions and how to lower them together. As a travel agency many of our emissions come from third party suppliers.

We will more actively attend the events offered by the international Glasgow Declaration network.

For 2024-25 travel programs we aim to offer regenerative tourism as an alternative part of travel packages. It again needs collaboration with several suppliers to achieve this goal.
